
# P4C Planner - P4C 计划者

#### Subject: P4C - Sad Earth

### Objectives:

- a) to think critically about a stimulus
- b) To ask questions about a stimulus
- c) To practice voting
- d) To participate positively in a discussion
- e) To think creatively for solutions

Resources: image of a sad earth, voting stars, paper and markers





#### PART ONE

- 1. Present the image to the children
- 2. Let them describe what they see. Explain to them that they will come up with some questions related to the image.
- 3. Have the class close their eyes for a moment, reminding them to think of questions we can talk about



- 4. When the children open their eyes, let them begin raising their hands and asking questions. Write their questions down on separate pieces of paper
- 5. Re-read the questions to the children, reminding them to think about which question is a good one to talk about
- 6. Review the process of voting with the children and then hand out the stars
- 7. Read one question aloud at a time and instruct the children to drop their star if that is the question they wish to discuss
- 8. When all of the questions have been read out loud and voted for, count the votes with the children

### PART TWO

- 9. Explain to the children that we will now discuss the voted on question in small groups. Instruct the other groups to go to their tables and draw a picture of how they can help to make the earth happy again
- 10. Teacher discusses the question with one group at a time, while the other teacher observes the children drawing. The discussion should last approximately 5 minutes
